

# **Exam Tips**

- Time management
  - Be aware of how many minutes you have per mark
  - Plan your answers\*
  - Cross off which questions already completed
- Answer the question being asked
  - Question word: List / Describe / Discuss
  - Number of marks
  - Answer all parts of question
  - Make your paper easy to correct





# **Online Exam Tips**

- Prepare as if it was closed book
- Open book notes
- Keep up to date (SAI news or The Actuary magazine)



- Practise on computer
- Planning



# **Online Exam Tips**

- Quiet and interruption free area
- Set an alarm for end of exam
- Save as you go









# After the exams

- No exam post-mortems
- Failure is, unfortunately, common
  - Focus on positives
  - Reassess your preparations
  - Talk to senior students / recently qualified actuaries
  - Exam counselling
- Don't give up!
- Enjoy yourself take a break
- Plan what to do next





€9.7bn was paid out in benefits and claims in 2019


Life insurance companies employed 7,987 people in Ireland in 2019. Total value of in force life assurance protection policies in 2019 was €490.8bn

Total value of policyholder's funds managed was €131.2bn in 2019. Majority of investments are held in equities (60%)



#### **Domestic Market**


#### Total Domestic Market Premium - Split By Product Type (€bn)

#### Total Domestic Market Premium - Breakdown By Company






#### Cross-Border Market

Total Cross-Border Market Premium (Life & Pensions) 2019:



#### The Role of a Life Actuary










Actuaries can fill several diverse roles within the operations of a life insurance company.





Scope to bring in business/economics/accounting knowledge in a business setting to be more than just a number cruncher

- Artificial Intelligence
- Sports analytics and training/performance optimisation
- Odds compiling/bookmakers
- Clinical trials

- Newsletter on SAI website provides interviews with some actuaries who have gone into wider fields and includes a Data Analytics Library





# What does a GI actuary do?

#### Pricing

- Identifying factors which predict level of risk of customers
- Analysis of business performance
- Big data and predictive analytics

#### Risk

- Identifying, measuring and monitoring risk
- Own Risk and Solvency Assessment (ORSA)
- KRIs





#### Current topics

#### Differential Pricing:



- Differential pricing is where customers with a similar risk and cost of service are charged different premiums for reasons other than risk and cost of service.
- Current pricing practices can lead to unfair outcomes for car and home insurance consumers.
  - Price walking ban
  - Providers review their pricing policies and processes annually
  - Consumer consent and disclosure requirements

## What is a profession?

- To serve the public interest by promoting thought leadership and contributing as an independent voice on matters where an actuarial perspective can add value.




